

## Accommodations for the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination (“MPRE”)

The MPRE is required for admission to the Bar of all but three U.S. jurisdictions (Maryland, Wisconsin, and Puerto Rico). (In addition, Connecticut and New Jersey accept successful completion of a law school course on professional responsibility in lieu of a passing score on the MPRE.) We recommend that students register for the MPRE during their second year of law school and after completion of the Professional Responsibility course.

The National Conference of Bar Examiners (“NCBE”) makes decisions on requests for test accommodations for the MPRE and provides reasonable accommodations for examinees who have qualified disabilities as defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments Act of 2008 (ADAAA) and who provide appropriate documentation in a timely manner. ### Requesting Test Accommodations for the MPRE

We strongly encourage you to complete the accommodations packet and submit it early in the registration period to facilitate a timely notification of the NCBE’s decision. The NCBE must **RECEIVE** your request for accommodations, including all supporting documentation, by the [late registration deadline](#) for your MPRE test date. Applicants whose requests are received fewer than 15 business days before the regular deadline run the risk of not having time to request reconsideration or provide additional documentation. The NCBE will not review any requests, forms, or documentation, including those for reconsideration, received after the deadline.

Applicants requesting testing accommodations for the MPRE must provide verification of past accommodations from educational institutions. You may either provide a copy of your official WLS accommodation letter or a [Certification of Accommodations History Form](#) completed by the ADA Coordinator. Please allow enough time for the ADA Coordinator to complete the form.
